Child abuse is a pervasive and deadly problem. Recent statistics show that in 2009, an estimated 763,000 children were determined to be victims of abuse or neglect. As in prior years, neglect was the most common form of child maltreatment, but victims also suffered from physical abuse, sexual abuse and psychological maltreatment. And an estimated 1,770 children died.

The purpose of a **Children's Advocacy Center (CAC)** is to provide services to child victims of child sexual and physical abuse and their non-offending family members. CAC's use a multi-disciplinary approach coordinating law enforcement, child protective services, prosecution, mental health, medical personnel and victim advocacy to provide the most comprehensive services available so that children are not re-victimized by the very system in place to protect them. A Children's Advocacy Center provides a comfortable child-friendly atmosphere where the child can feel safe and staff are specially trained to deal with the issues of child victimization.
